Tuesday, September 28, 2021:

The day kicked off with a 9:00 pre-convention tour of the Great Plains Zoo and Delbridge Museum of Natural History.

The First General Session:

The afternoon began with President Rhonda Preller calling the 2021 State Convention to order followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.
